Mid-February I was diagnosed with breast cancer. 1. Transfer from Women's Secret Society to Christ

Last newsletter we reported that with the help of Brother Abraham Turay, 12 year old Isatu, escaped from bullying, early marriage, and forced female genital mutilation. These were being imposed by the women in her villages Women's Secret Society. Isatu is living with Abraham's family and attending school with help from a scholarship through Transformation Education. We thank God for another similar salvation story.

As Abraham was leading a Bible study in a village two moms and their teenage daughters who attended came up to him and said "We quit with the secret society. It is not bringing any profit." They asked to spend Christmas with Abraham to learn more about Jesus. During Christmas, together they went in the forest, built a big fire and burned all the tools they used to use for female genital mutilation and other secret society rituals. The four ladies were baptized, and now they are telling others to leave the Women's Secret Societies and turn to Jesus for salvation.
